The Lincolnshire Show Equine Information and Regulations

Horse of the Year Show Qualifiers:

Please ensure that the Exhibitor, Owner, Rider and Horse all have HOYS User IDs

If you do not have a User ID please contact HOYS directly on 02476 858 205 or email them on entries@grandstand.co.uk

Please note all HOYS classes include a £18 charge that goes directly to HOYS $% \left(\mathcal{A}_{1}^{2}\right) =0$

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependent on breed/ type of animal.

Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

Please also ensure that you are correctly registered with the appropriate Horse Society before making your entry. If you are unsure, please contact the society directly.

Stabling

Permanent stables available when booking through Showing Scene, limited numbers are available, we encourage early booking to avoid disappointment

Animal Health Note:

The Primary Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all equines attending the Lincolnshire Show. 'If sufficient time has elapsed' after the Primary two vaccinations, these should be followed by their six month and yearly vaccinations. No equines should enter competitions within 7 days of vaccination

(This Rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/BEF

The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 - 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an El vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old

Wristband Allocation

Admission onto the Showground from the Horsebox Park will only be allowed for people wearing Equine Wristbands (inc. riders & their associates).

Extra Wristbands

If you require extra wristbands for your equine team/owners/riders you can purchase Additional Equine Wristbands at £20 each via our online entry system Showing Scene Pre-Show (5 maximum per person)

If you require more than 5 these can be purchased as Pre-Show Admission Tickets on www.lincolnshireshow.co.uk

Prize Money

- Will be issued in the form of Prize Payment Cards; these can be redeemed at the showground on the day or posted to the showground for BACS payment after the show, more details will be on your prize payment card
- Please read, understand and undertake to abide by the REGULATIONS & INFORMATION and the Conditions specific to all classes entered, as published in the Equine Prize Schedule

Cancellation Statement

There may be circumstances where the show must be postponed, cancelled, abandoned, or curtailed because of circumstances beyond the control of the Society, for example as a result of a security alert or as a result of inclement weather making it impractical to hold the Show. In such circumstances once any administration fees have been deducted, entry fees will be refunded, but the HOYS contribution is non-refundable. The Society will have no liability for loss or damage suffered by exhibitors or others.

Refunds

Refunds on entry fees will only be considered if a vet/medical certificate is supplied to the Lincolnshire Agricultural Society office by 12noon on Friday 13th June, stating that the animal/exhibitor is unfit to show, and provided that the exhibitor pack, containing all wristbands, vehicle passes etc. are returned unused to the Livestock & Equine Secretary by 12noon on Monday 16th June 2025.

Entries not forward for any reason other than injury or illness will forfeit all entry fees.

IN-HAND SHIRE HORSES

Conditions:



- 1. The Society is affiliated to and classes will be judged under the Shire Horse Society Rules
- Classes are restricted to paid up members of the Shire Horse Society. Entries will not be accepted from anyone who has been either suspended or removed from membership of the Shire Horse Society
- 3. All animals except Geldings must have been entered in the Shire Horse Society's Stud Book or Grade Registers 'A' and 'B'. All Geldings must be by a Registered Shire Stallion
- 4. Exhibitors in all competitive classes are not permitted to enter an animal in any class, which is to be judged by a person who has owned, loaned or bred the animal, or is a blood relation or spouse. The onus of complying with the regulation rests entirely on the exhibitor
- 5. It shall be a condition of entry that the In-Hand Shire prize winners shall attend the Grand Parade on Wednesday. An exhibitor or their staff/helpers failing to comply with this regulation shall forfeit their £20 premium

OFFER OF SILVER-PLATED SPOONS AND ROSETTES AT AFFILIATED SHOWS FOR MARES and FILLIES

Conditions of the Award are as follows:

- 1. A Spoon and a Rosette for the Best Mare or Filly
- 2. The winner of the Special Prize must be a member of the Shire Horse Society.
- 3. Entries cannot be accepted at Affiliated Shows in classes for Shires or Heavy Horses from any person who has been either suspended or removed from membership of the Shire Horse Society or has been excluded from exhibiting for prizes at Shows, Sales or Exhibitions or from taking part in any Show organised by the Shire Horse Society
- 4. No animal to be eligible to take more than one Silver Spoon during any one year. The Shire Horse Society Spring Show being excepted
- 5. THE WINNING ANIMAL MUST BE REGISTERED OR ELIGIBLE FOR REGISTRATION IN THE STUD BOOK OR GRADE B REGISTER
- The Judge invited to officiate must be on the Society's Official Panel and has the right to withhold the award of the Silver Spoon and Rosette if an exhibit does not show sufficient merit
- 7. The Council reserves the right in offering Spoons, to award them only to persons approved by the Shire Horse Society

IN-HAND SUFFOLK

To be judged on Wednesday, following the Shire Horses

Conditions:

- This show is affiliated to the Suffolk Horse Society (SHS) and classes 14-18 are qualifiers for championship points for annually awarded trophies and for the Supreme Suffolk Horse Championship.
- All entries for In Hand classes must be registered in or eligible for registration in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud book. All entries must state their SHS registration number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix.
- All foals must be eligible for registration in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud Book. Both the sire and the dam must be registered and entered in the pedigree section of the UK Suffolk Stud Book.
- All stallions must be registered in the Pedigree Section of the UK Suffolk Stud book.
- All entries must state their SHS registration number, stallion license number and full pedigree name including prefix or affix. Discretionary entry to a stallion class may be allowed in cases where a license is pending but not yet issued.
- It shall be a condition of entry that the In-Hand Suffolk prize winners attend the Grand Parade on Wednesday. An exhibitor or their staff/helpers failing to comply with this regulation shall forfeit their £20 premium.

- 3. All entries to be under the strict supervision of an adult.

Qualifiers:

- 1. This Class is a Qualifier for the Midland Shire Foal Society Show & Sale's Young Handler of the Year Award.
- 2. Suffolk Horse Society Rosette for the highest place Suffolk Young Handler and qualification to the Suffolk Horse Society Young Handler Championship.
- 3. Shire Young Handler Accumulator Competition

The Shire Horse Society will once again be running the SHS Young Handler's Accumulator Award in 2025. Points relative to placings will be awarded to those young handlers who are 2024 members of the Shire Horse Society.

The winner will be announced at the end of the year. Points will be awarded to the top five, with points awarded as follows:- 1st-5 points, 2nd-4 points, 3rd- 3 points, 4th-2 points and 5th- 1 point.

The Champion Young Handler with the most points at the end of the year will win the trophy.

Those taking part in the above should be Junior members of the Society and are able to join mid-season if they are not already members. Points will only count once membership is taken up and points will not be back dated. Junior memberships are £10 per annum and are open to those that have not attained their 18th birthday.

BRITISH RIDDEN HEAVY HORSE OF THE YEAR

Ring Name: Main Ring

To be judged on Wednesday

Conditions:

This competition is for purebred mares, geldings and stallions 4 years old or over, that are registered in the main British Stud Books of the Shire, Clydesdale, Suffolk or Percheron Horse Societies, to be ridden. Part Breds are not eligible to compete. All Riders and Owners must be Members of either the Shire Horse Society, The Clydesdale Horse Society, The Suffolk Horse Society or British Percheron Horse Society.

This class will be run in accordance with the British Ridden Heavy Horse Society however the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook will take precedence, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk.

This is a Horse of the Year Show Qualifier, all data given upon entry of this class is provided to Grandstand Media Limited and stored on the Grandstand Entries System.

For Clydesdale horses, they are to hold a Clydesdale Horse Society passport with full pedigree details, stallions and mares are to appear in the main section of the Clydesdale Horse stud book and geldings are to have appeared as produce of their dam.

Qualifiers should be marked in the following way:

Ride: 50 maximum

Conformation: 50 maximum

In the case of equality, the horse with the highest conformation mark will be deemed the winner. If there still be equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 8 - 12 October 2025. Qualification will not pass below 5th place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

This class entitles eligible amateur combinations to earn points for the Premier Amateur League, with the opportunity of gaining a wild card place at HOYS 2025. This is open to current TSR members or those that have signed up to the Premier Amateur League 2025, for more information see www.theshowingregister.co.uk.

This competition is for hunters, mares or geldings, 4 years old or over, to be ridden. All Riders, Owners and Producers must be Members of the British Show Horse Association, The Showing Register or Sport Horse Breeding GB. Horses must be registered with the British Show Horse Association, The Showing Register or Sport Horse Breeding GB. Entries in this class may not compete in the Small Show Hunter of the Year, and vice versa. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form.

Conditions:

- 1. For Classes 32, 33, 34 and 36 please state HOYS ID numbers and BSHA, SHB(GB),TSR Registration numbers for Owners. Riders and Horses on your Entry. (For Horse of the Year Show ID numbers please contact Grandstand Media on 024 76858205)
- 2. For Class 31 please state SHB(GB) Registration numbers for Owners, Riders and Horses on your Entry
- 3. The Society is affiliated to and classes 32, 33, 34 and 36 will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk
- 4. Entries in classes 32 to 34 may not compete in class 36 and vice versa
- 5. For classes 32 to 34, competitors must enter their horses in the appropriate sections, but class 32 will be judged first, and the judges shall have the power to transfer exhibits to classes 33 or 34 if they deem necessary
- 6. Qualification will not pass below 5th place. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show Office
- Judges may be asked to restrict riding to those entries selected for final consideration, having due regard to the judging time available
- In accordance with the rules of the Lincolnshire Agricultural Society, all competitors must wear a skull cap or hat and safety harness according to the correct approved BSI or European Standard at all times. Any competitor not adhering to this will be asked to leave the ring/class
- 9. Classes 31 and 39 are to be judged under the 2025 Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain rules. SHB (GB) require all exhibits in Classes 30 and 39 to be registered on their Basic Identity Record or Stud Book. Owners and riders need to be current members of SHB (GB). SHB (GB) Registration Numbers to be quoted on the Entry Form for when entering these two Classes

Day Tickets

This entitles competitors to compete at a maximum of 2 shows in the year - it covers owner and rider membership together with horse registration for that show. If the class is a qualifying class for RIHS, in order for the qualification to be valid, application for full owner/rider membership and horse registration must be received in the SHB(GB) office within 14 days

Qualifiers:

a) This is a Horse of the Year Show Qualifier, all data given upon entry of this class is provided to Grandstand Media Limited and stored on the Grandstand Entries System. For full policy details please visit www. grandstandentries.com

Horses competing at the Horse of the Year Show and qualifying shows in The Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain classes at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

- b) The highest placed unqualified exhibit in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Supreme of Season Final. The Finals will be held at the BSHA Hunter & National Championship Shows in September 2025.
- c) This Show is a Qualifier for IRISH DRAUGHT HORSE SOCIETY (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge. The highest placed horse (not already qualified) from each of the following classes 31, 32, 33, 34 and 36 that is registered or eligible for registration on the Irish Draught or Irish Draught Sport Horse Registers, i.e. with a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding, will qualify for the Final of the IDHS (GB) Ridden Challenge. Horses need not be registered with the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) to qualify, but MUST be on the IDHS (GB) registers by the time of the Championship which will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show at Onley Equestrian Centre, Onley Grounds Farm, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire CV23 8AJ

NB: A horse may only qualify for the Final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered

Each Qualifier will receive a card. Qualifiers are required to complete an online form at www.idhsgb.com to inform the IDHS (GB) that they have qualified for the Final. In the Final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money and a Trophy. The Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Pure Bred will be awarded a Trophy and £100 and the highest placed 158cm (15.2hh) and under will receive a Trophy and £50, the highest placed Sport Horse will receive a trophy and £50

This competition is for Working Hunters, any weight, mares, geldings or stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old or over, exceeding 148cm, to be ridden. Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes. Open to registered horses to be ridden by Adult, Associate and Junior Members. Club Members are NOT eligible.

Qualifies for: The British Showjumping National Championships.

Qualifying period: 1st July-30th June.

Numbers to qualify: Two double clears to qualify to the final. Double clear qualifications will not be obtained from one round competitions (e.g. Table A4 or Table A (1 Round))

Rule 274,274.5,274.6. Table A. Speed 375mpm. Start Height 1.30m.

Open to Adult, Associate and Junior Members. Club Members are NOT eligible.

The order of starting must be drawn.

This competition takes place over six, eight or 10 obstacles which are progressively more difficult. No combination obstacles are allowed. The progressive difficulty is not solely due to the height and spread of the obstacles, but also to the difficulty of the track.

Points are awarded as follows:

One point for obstacle No. 1 cleared, two points for No. 2, three points for No. 3 etc. with total of 21, 36 or 55 points.

No point is awarded for an obstacle knocked down. Faults other than knock-downs are penalised as for Table A and any of these faults, including time faults, are converted into points and deducted from any jumping points scored.

In the event of equality of points for first place, there will be a jump-off against the clock over a shortened course, over obstacles that may be increased in height and/or spread. The obstacles in the jump-off must be jumped in the same order as in the first round and retain their respective points allotted in the first round. This competition may also take place directly against the clock.

For the last obstacle of the course, an alternative obstacle may be provided, of which one part may be designated the Joker. The Joker must be more difficult than the alternative obstacle and carry double points. If the Joker is knocked down, the points must be deducted from the total.

This competition may not be restricted to invited riders or limited to less than 40 entries.

Qualifies for: The Queen Elizabeth II Cup at the Royal International Horse Show.

Numbers to qualify: The top 20 riders on the Area/International Trials points list, for the period April - September. Points will be awarded to riders placed 6th= or higher in Area Trials on the following scale; riders placed equal will share equally the total points attributable to the combined placings (for example, four riders placed 4th equal receive: 8+4+2+0 divided by 4 = 3.5 points each).

1st64 points2nd32 points3rd16 points4th8 points5th4 points6th2 points.

Points are awarded to each rider as the result of his/her best six results on points in Area Trials held during the qualifying period. Visiting Members are eligible to compete in Area Trial competitions, but will not be awarded points. For the purposes only of calculating points, the placings of Visiting Members will be disregarded and points will be awarded to the remaining competitors according to their adjusted placings once this has been done.

All riders and their associates should wear equine exhibitor wristbands for the period of the show. These wristbands will admit from the Horse Vehicle Park ONLY into the show. You are asked to have these in place for checks upon arrival. Further checks will take place as you pass into the showground to the horse judging rings.

Horse Vehicle Passes

Equine exhibitors will receive one vehicle pass for the day(s) in which they are competing only. Heavy Horse and Private Driving will receive two vehicle passes. All vehicles transporting horses and ponies to the show will be directed to enter via Gate 4. Please note only horseboxes and cars towing trailers will be admitted into the horse vehicle parking area. No non-towing cars are to be parked in horsebox parking due to capacity. Please park in the general car parking.

Exhibitor packs will be sent out at the end of May/ beginning of June.

Horse Passports and Equine Influenza Vaccination Requirements A DEFRA acceptable passport must be produced for every horse entering the showground. It is understood that some horses whose primary vaccinations pre date the official passport may still have these entered on a separate document; this document must also have the identification of the horse or pony completed.

The horse must have been vaccinated against equine influenza by a veterinary surgeon in accordance with the regulations below. The horse must have received two primary vaccinations which are given not less than 21 days and not more than 92 days apart.

If sufficient time has elapsed, the horse must also have received:

- a) a booster vaccination which is given not less than 150 days and not more than 215 days after the second component of the primary vaccination, and:
- b) further booster vaccinations at intervals of not more than a year apart (or such lesser time as the Authority may, in an emergency, decide). Vaccination on the anniversary is acceptable.

None of these injections must have been given within the preceding seven days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables. Spot checks will be made at the show.

Stabling

Veterinary Team

All equine health & welfare concerns are with the Veterinary Team, from Hill and Phelan Veterinary Practice, available on site during the day and night of the event.

The Veterinary emergency contact number is displayed in the Equine Awards Office and with the Gate Security

Veterinary Charges

Exhibitors are liable for any costs incurred from treatment carried out by the Show's Veterinary Officers. In the event of death of an animal the costs associated with the disposal of the carcase are the responsibility of the exhibitor.

Veterinary Inspection

In all classes horses must be sound. Horses will not be subjected to a Veterinary examination except where considered necessary by a judge or on a protest being lodged. The Veterinary Surgeons shall be empowered to expel from the Showground any animal, which in their opinion is suffering from or affected with any contagious or infectious disease likely to prove harmful to other animals, or, any animal which in their opinion is unfit for exhibition. The Veterinary Surgeons shall issue a certificate recording their findings.

The Society reserves the right, for an appointed Veterinary Surgeon to take blood samples at random, for subsequent analysis, from any animal exhibited at the Show. Exhibitors shall be liable to pay the Society a sum not exceeding £50 as and for liquidating damages, in respect of each animal expelled under the above clauses.


Misuse of Drugs

The Lincolnshire Agricultural Society prohibits the administration to Show exhibits of tranquillisers and other substances which may in any way affect the performance of the animal in question or have the effect of making I behave in the Show Ring in a manner which is not natural. Any exhibitor (or his/her representative) who is found to have administered or permitted the administration of any such substance to any show exhibit will be dealt with at the LAS's discretion. In addition, the matter will be referred to the appropriate Breed Society or Organisation.

Exhibitors must not bring tranquilisers or sedative on to the showground. The LAS reserves the right for an Honorary Show Veterinary Officer to take any necessary samples for subsequent analysis from any animal exhibited at the Show.

Malpractice

An Exhibitor who shall attempt to obtain a prize by means of a false declaration or by any unlawful prohibited or unfair means shall have all awards made to him/her cancelled, and shall be disqualified from exhibition at future Shows of the Society.

Measurement

Horses entered in classes subject to height restrictions and not being in possession of a measurement certificate issued jointly by the British Horse Society, the National Pony Society and British Showjumping will be measured **at the discretion of the Judges or Stewards**

Prizes Awarded

The judges may withhold any prize or prizes if in their opinion the exhibits in any Class do not possess sufficient merit.

Prize winners will be given a voucher which can be redeemed on the day, or by post if received by the LAS

Please note: all prizes to be cashed within 6 months of Show.

Challenge Trophies

All Challenge Trophies and Cups offered shall be held by the Winner for one year or until requested to return the same to the Society. It is advised that winners take out appropriate insurance for the duration for which the trophy is in their possession.

All trophies and cups must be returned before the 2026 Lincolnshire Show. The Lincolnshire Agricultural Society does not engrave trophies.

It is the winner's responsibility to engrave a trophy should they wish to. Please use a font type and size consistent with any precedent set.

Horse of the Year Show Qualifiers

Please ensure that the Exhibitor, Owner, Rider and Horse all have HOYS User IDs.

Please note all HOYS classes include a £18 charge that goes directly to HOYS.

Riding Hats

Correctly secured British Standard Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet current approved BSI or European Safety Standards MUST be worn by riders 18 years and under, riders competing in Intermediate, Mountain and Moorland classes and riders in the jumping phase of the Working Hunter Horse/Pony.

Competitors are reminded that hats should have a plain cover and should be as per the guidelines set out in the specific class and/or society ruling; black, navy, blue, brown, grey or green as appropriate.

A rider whose hat comes off will be disqualified.

A rider, whose strap comes undone whilst competing must on penalty of disqualification, replace it or fasten it before continuing. The rider may stop without penalty to refasten the strap.

Equine Society Registrations

Please ensure that you are registered with the appropriate Horse or Pony Society before making your entry. If you are unsure, please contact the society directly.

Conduct of Exhibitors and their Attendants

Any act of discourtesy to any judge, steward, show official or staff member by or on behalf of an exhibitor or their attendants will at the discretion of the injured party be immediately disqualified from being judged. In which case entry fees, prizes and charges will be forfeited.

We operate a strict no tolerance to abuse – verbal or physical – towards to any judge, steward, show official or staff member or other competitor/exhibitor and their attendants.

Dogs

Dogs must be kept on short fixed leads at all times whilst on the Showground furthermore dogs must NOT be left in cars.

Protests

Any protest must be lodged in writing within one hour of the class being judged, together with a deposit of £50 and handed in to the Society Office (Joseph Nickerson Building). If on investigation the protest is not sustained to the satisfaction of the Honorary Show Director and Stewards of the Section concerned or if the said protest shall prove to be frivolous the person so protecting shall forfeit his/her deposit.

Judges Interest in Animals

Exhibitors are not permitted to enter an animal in any class which is to be judged by a person who has bred or who has a financial interest in the animal. The onus on complying with this regulation rests entirely with the exhibitor. However, if through unforeseen circumstances, a judge has before him/her an animal which he/ she bred, owned, produced, had at livery in his/her yard or from which they have had financial gain, he/she shall place all the other animals in the class and shall then call in a referee judge to place the animal in question.

Substitution of Judges

The Society reserves the right to substitute other judges for those mentioned in this schedule or make additional appointments without notification to Exhibitors and other. All entries are accepted on this understanding and there will be no refund of entry fees where substitutions are made. Notification of changes to judges in advance of the Show will be posted when possible on the website www.lincolnshireshow.co.uk

Judges

Judges are not to be spoken to be any ringside spectator or exhibitor during the time judging is taking place and the Stewards will be asked to stop this practice.

Judging Order

Horse will be required in their respective Judging Rings in Catalogue order, as directed by the Stewards, unless otherwise stated in the Schedule. (Showjumping classes will be in drawn order)

Disclaimer of Liability

a) The Society and its officers shall not be responsible for any person whatsoever while upon the Society's premises, or while entering and leaving the same, for any damage or loss however caused to the property of any such person or for any injury, fatal or otherwise, to any such person.

- b) The Society and its officers shall not be responsible for any accident, damage or loss however caused that may occur to any exhibitor or his servant or to any animal, article, or property exhibited or brought onto the Showground by him. Each exhibitor shall indemnify the Society from and against all actions, suits expenses or claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury however caused.
- c) The Society will not under any circumstance accept liability for any loss of damage (whether direct or indirect) arising from or caused by the abandonment or cancellation, whether total or partial, or the postponement of any show, display, event, meeting or other happening on the Showground or elsewhere for whatever reason.
- d) The Society reserves the right to postpone, cancel, abandon or curtail any show, display, event, meeting, happening or otherwise to be held on the Showground or elsewhere if under the auspices of the Society. Where the decision to postpone, cancel abandon or curtail any show, display, event, meeting, happening or otherwise arises from directives, happenings outside the control of the Society, the Society will refund entry fees, once any administration fees have been deducted. The Society will not be under any liability for any loss or damage (whether direct or indirect, consequential or otherwise) arising from or caused by a postponement, cancellation, abandonment, curtailment or otherwise.
- e) The Exhibitor will have in force, maintain and comply with the terms of its own appropriate insurance (with a minimum limit of £5 million per claim for Public, Products and Pollution Liability) to cover all risks and liabilities which the Exhibitor may incur.
- f) The Lincolnshire Agricultural Society's maximum aggregate liability (for breach of contract or arising in tort or on any other basis whatsoever) shall be limited to the entry fee paid by the Exhibitor).

Health & Safety

- a) It is the responsibility of all exhibitors to comply with any Health and Safety requirements placed on them whilst competing at the Show. Any exhibitor who fails to comply with health and safety or fire safety legislation may be liable to enforcement action by the West Lindsey District Council Environmental Health Officer and/or the Eurofire representative.
- b) Horse walks have been laid out by the Society and it is imperative that ridden, driven and in-hand horses keep within these designated routes and take guidance from Officials or Stewards at crossing points, etc...
- c) Total separation between horses and the general public may in certain instances be impossible and it is suggested that if an exhibitor has a nervous/highly strung animal he/she should consider whether it is prudent for him/her to risk bringing this animal to a busy agricultural Show.
