The Lincolnshire Show Equine Information and Regulations

Horse of the Year Show Qualifiers:

Please ensure that the Exhibitor, Owner, Rider and Horse all have HOYS User IDs.

If you do not have a User ID please contact HOYS directly on 02476 858 205 or email them on entries@grandstand.co.uk

Please note all HOYS classes include a £18 charge that goes directly to HOYS.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependent on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

Please also ensure that you are correctly registered with the appropriate Horse Society before making your entry. If you are unsure, please contact the society directly.

2024 Animal Health NOTE:

The Primary Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all equines attending the Lincolnshire Show. 'If sufficient time has elapsed' after the Primary two vaccinations, these should be followed by their six month and yearly vaccinations. No equines should enter competitions within 7 days of an

El vaccination.

(This Rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/BEF.

The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 - 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an El vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old.)

Wristbands

Admission onto the Showground from the Horsebox Park will only be allowed for people wearing Equine Wristbands (inc. riders & their associates).

Extra Wristbands

If you require extra wristbands for your equine team/owners/riders you can purchase Additional Equine Wristbands at £20 each via our online entry system Showing Scene Pre-Show, (5 maximum per person). If you require more than 5 these can be purchased as Pre-Show Admission Tickets on www.lincolnshireshow.co.uk

PRIZE MONEY

Will be issued in the form of Prize Payment Cards; these can be redeemed at the showground on the day or posted to the showground for BACS payment after the show, more details will be on your prize payment card.

Cancellation Statement

There may be circumstances where the show must be postponed, cancelled, abandoned, or curtailed because of circumstances beyond the control of the Society, for example as a result of a security alert or as a result of inclement weather making it impractical to hold the Show. In such circumstances once any administration fees have been deducted, entry fees will be refunded, but the HOYS contribution is non-refundable. The Society will have no liability for loss or damage suffered by exhibitors or others.

Lincolnshire Show Regulations / Health Declaration (Equine)

Please note that by making entries into the Lincolnshire Show you are declaring:

- That the animals described in the entries are free from clinical signs of disease. You further declare that you will take all due precautions to prevent the animal(s) from being exposed to infectious or contagious disease previous to the Show.
- That you have read, understand and undertake to abide by the REGULATIONS & INFORMATION and the Conditions specific to all classes entered, as published in the Equine Prize Schedule.

The declaration is a tick box as you make your ONLINE Entry.

PRIVATE DRIVING and Concours d'Elegance

Ring Name: Main Ring

Judging will take place in the Main Ring in the morning of Thursday, 20 June (Concours D'Elegance judged during the classes)

- Assemble for Pre-Judging in the Horse Box Vehicle Park 45 minutes before the class is due to start.
- The entrants will proceed to the Main Ring together, accompanied by a steward.

Conditions:

This Show is affiliated to the British Driving Society and these classes will be run in accordance with BDS procedures.

Private Driving - Singles, Pairs and Multiples

Horse or Pony driven to a traditional or traditional style vehicle.

A traditional vehicle means a vehicle of traditional profile and identifiable type to resemble the design of a carriage built prior to the First World War. The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyres vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible.

1. Nomination entries are not accepted.
2. Vehicles must be of a suitable type for road use and match the horse (Commercial vehicles and Show Wagons not allowed).
3. Horses and ponies must be four years old or over.
4. Competitors should ensure that they are adequately covered by Third Party Insurance.
5. Any driver under the age of 18 should be accompanied in the vehicle by an adult. BDS Rules apply.

Qualifiers:

Horse of the Year Show Qualifier 2024. Class C93 is a qualifier for the Harness Horse and Pony Championship at the 2024 Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 9 - 13 October 2024. Qualification will be awarded to the highest placed turnout in the Private Driving Championship down to 6th place, disregarding those already qualified. Judging Criteria: The best horse/ponies irrespective of size, correctly and smartly harnessed to a sound, suitable and well-maintained traditional type vehicle, suitable for a competent whip to drive in company.

Exhibitors must be fully paid up members of the British Driving Society to be eligible for class C94. This is a Horse of the Year Show Qualifier, all data given upon entry of this class is provided to Grandstand Media Limited and stored on the Grandstand Entries System. The Combination of horses/ponies, vehicle and driver that qualifies must be the same at the 2024 Horse of the Year Championship.

The vehicle must be a traditional style vehicle.

Young Drivers - The driver must be aged 8 years or over on the first day of the show at which they are to compete. A driver under the age of 18 must be accompanied in the vehicle by a competent and responsible person aged 18 years or over, a "responsible adult". Proof of age will be required if necessary. It is the responsibility of the owner/driver (if over 18) or (if the owner/driver is under 18) the responsible adult to ensure that his/her groom/s is/are competent for the purpose of attending to the turnout and aged 8 or over on the day of the show. When in the vehicle grooms, passenger/s and driver must have their feet firmly on the floor of the vehicle or use a suitable fixed footrest. This regulation applies at all times and in all areas on the

showground.

Hard Hat Ruling - All drivers/grooms/passengers under the age of 14 years must wear a correctly fitted hard hat when in a carriage or in attendance to a turnout. The Combination of horses/ponies, vehicle and driver that qualifies must be the same at the 2024 Horse of the Year Championship.

Please Note: Exhibitors who are not members of the British Driving Society may enter these classes, however they may not qualify for the Horse of the Year Show. Please include your membership number on your entry form or state that you are not a member. When competing at the Show please carry your British Driving Society membership card.

S94	<p align="center">Concours d'Elegance</p>	<p>CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE REGULATIONS:</p> <p>This class is held under the rules of the British Driving Society and Exhibitors must be members of that Society.</p> <p>ALL turnouts which have been separately entered in the Private Driving Classes are eligible to compete.</p> <p>THE CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE is designed to establish the most elegant turnout. The essence of the competition is the word "elegance" and the winner will be the turnout which, in the opinion of the Judge, presents the most elegant effect. This will obviously include vehicle, horse, driver, passengers, etc., but above all, the general impression. Attention may well be paid to drivers' and passengers' personal costume, as it may contribute to the overall picture, but a fancy dress or period costume is definitely barred. The whole object of the class is to establish which turnout presents the most pleasing picture and normal judging criteria do not apply. It is judged from a distance and vehicles are NOT closely inspected as in ordinary show classes. To be driven at park pace.</p>
