



Terms and Conditions

Lincolnshire Agricultural Society's 'A Royal Rhyme'

- The invitation to enter applies to all primary and secondary school children within Greater Lincolnshire.
- Entries will be judged within the following categories: KS1/KS2/KS3/KS4.
- Applications should name the child's school on the entry form, along with key stage and teacher details.
- All poems must be within the 1 side of A4 stipulated.
- Poems must incorporate the theme of the Platinum Jubilee.
- Poems must be sent into the email by the date specified (midnight Wednesday 11th May).
- By entering the competition, you are allowing the Lincolnshire Agricultural Society (LAS) to use the poem for publicity and marketing purposes.
- There is no limit on the number of entries a single entrant can make. All entries will be considered anonymously by the judges.
- Entries will not be returned so please keep a copy.
- No alterations to the poems are permitted once entered.
- Entries via email will receive a confirmation email of receipt.
- The LAS reserve the right to change the judging panel without notice.
- The judges read all entries and their decision is final. Neither the judges, or LAS will enter into any correspondence.
- The poet's name must not appear on the poem itself.
- All poems must have a title and must not exceed the stated length (one side of A4).
- Poems must be in English and be the entrant's original work.
- Prize winners will be notified by email after the deadline has passed and the overall winning entry will be read aloud and displayed at the Lincolnshire Show.
- The copyright of each poem remains with the author. However, authors, by entering the competition, grant the LAS the right in perpetuity to publish, record, display and/or broadcast their poem. Use of poems elsewhere for one year from June 2022 is subject to permission from the LAS.
- The overall winner will receive, for their school a £400 National Book token, and an individual prize of £100 National Book token. The author of the category winning poems alone, will receive £25 National Book token for the author and £75 Book token for their school.
